- Participate in seminars/workshops on various aspects of the federal securities laws. Past presentations have included: An Overview of Federal Securities Laws; Securities Fraud on the Internet; a Testimony Taking Workshop; Mergers and Acquisitions; and the SEC's Investigative Process.

- You must be a United States citizen or a citizen of an allied nation.
- You must be enrolled at an accredited law school.
- You must be completing your first year of law school by summer 2010.
